## **CCCU Supports Homeless and At-Risk Students**

[LAS VEGAS, Nev.] – August 11, 2020 – [Clark County Credit Union](#) (CCCU) announced their support of Project 150 with a \$10,000 donation plus a dry cereal box drive with more than 100 boxes donated by credit union employees. Project 150 provides support to teens and their families who are homeless, displaced or disadvantaged throughout Clark County.

“With the increase in families who have been affected by the pandemic, we realized our community was in need of additional support,” said Matt Kershaw, CCCU President and CEO. “CCCU supports the credit union philosophy ‘People Helping People,’ by providing scholarships, volunteerism, and other good deeds in our community.”

A grant through the Federal Home Loan Bank’s COVID-19 Pandemic Relief Program matched CCCU’s initial \$5,000 donation, allowing Project 150 to increase their food purchases and help even more families. Since the start of the pandemic, the nonprofit has seen the number of families needing support increase by five times their usual traffic numbers.

Another way CCCU is giving back to the local community is with a school supply drive to support two underprivileged elementary students for the upcoming school year.
