## **2021 Smart Start Scholarship Honorees**

[LAS VEGAS, Nev.] – May 14, 2021 – In celebration of Clark County Credit Union’s (CCCU) 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary, seven Smart Start Scholarships were awarded to qualifying students as part of CCCU’s ongoing effort to help members realize their financial goals and dreams through education. A \$1,000 scholarship was awarded to seven students who met application requirements and were either graduating high school seniors or currently enrolled in a state-accredited college or university.
